



## Thank you for being a presenter at the 8<sup>th</sup> BSC Doctoral Symposium

We have created these guidelines to help you and your audience get the most out of your session. For this edition of the Doctoral Symposium, we will use ZOOM Meetings. If you are not that familiar with ZOOM Meetings, please make sure to read these guidelines carefully: the success of the Doctoral Symposium depends a lot on active and lively sessions. Please see below some important information about the event.

### 8th BSC Doctoral Symposium guidance information for presenters (ZOOM Meetings)

#### 1. Important Information

- Please make sure to check your internet connection and headset (if you will use one) before your session to avoid any problems with your sound, connection, video or the presentation/poster.
- Join the Zoom meeting **at least five minutes before** the start of your talk or poster session.
- For the talk sessions: the session chair will briefly introduce you to the audience, your abstract title and the topic of the session.
- For the poster sessions: You will join one of the 3 break-out rooms that you will be assigned to before it will start. The person responsible for your breakout room will introduce you to the audience, your abstract title and the topic of the poster.
- Please unmute yourself and turn your video ON if you are presenting.
- Share your screen and your presentation/poster with the audience.
- Presenters are expected to remain online for the entire block of talks.

#### About presentations duration

Type	Duration	Format
Presentations	<b>20 minutes</b>	Each speaker will have 20 minutes allocated of which 15 minutes will be for presenting and 5 minutes for questions.
Posters	<b>10 minutes</b>	Each speaker will have 10 minutes allocated of which 5 minutes will be for presenting and 5 minutes for questions. There will be <b>3 Zoom break out rooms</b> for each poster session and every poster presenter will be assigned to one of them.
Tutorials	<b>2 hours &amp; 30 minutes</b>	The tutorials may follow a variety of formats and are divided into two sessions (one day each). Please see the agenda for more information about the tutorial sessions schedule.

**Note:** Sessions are grouped and contain several presentations, often with varying lengths' timeslots. For example, a 1-hour time slot session may have up to three 20-minute presentations. Session chairs will keep speakers to time.

## 2. Questions/Answers sessions:

Our goal is to handle as many questions as possible, however, given that there is a limited time for presentations, if attendees have any **questions**:

Attendees will write their questions in the ZOOM chat window and during **Q/A session** (after each speaker has ended his/her presentation), the Doctoral Symposium assigned session chair will read the questions to speakers.
